The Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology seeks 2 Course Instructors, 0.25 FCE (approximately 50 hours) each for the following course:

MRS267H: Principles of Pharmacology for Medical Radiation Sciences

MRS267H: Principles of Pharmacology in Medical Radiation Sciences allow students to gain a broad understanding of the principles that govern the fate of drugs in the body (pharmacokinetics) and how they exert their effects (pharmacodynamics). Through online lectures and in-class active learning discussions students will apply and integrate this knowledge to better understand both the clinical uses and limitations of drugs in medical practice today. In class learning will focus on key applications of drugs commonly used in medical practice.

Qualifications: Extensive theoretical knowledge of molecular and/or clinical pharmacology. A doctorate degree in Pharmacology is required. A high level of reliability, responsibility, independence, maturity and self-reliance are essential and applicants are encouraged to provide concrete evidence of these skills in their applications. Previous experience engaging with students through diverse courses in Pharmacology or Biomedical Toxicology. Experience with problem based or active learning ideal. Applicants should highlight any previous experience as an educator or teaching assistant. Excellent written language skills and interpersonal skills are desired.

The position requires time management and working with other faculty and course instructors. A high level of reliability, responsibility, independence, maturity and self-reliance are essential. The appreciation of the unique nature of professional programs and the use of online or inverted classrooms using online teaching tools is ideal.

Duties:

- Provide 10 active learning sessions (tutorials) for students
- Develop problem- based learning questions and case studies for active learning sessions (based on 1/3 of the course)
- Grading student participating, presentations and submitted assignment throughout the term.
- Exam Invigilating
- Assisting with Blackboard- and student management/communication
- Working with the Course Director in the development of quiz and exam questions
