# DEPARTMENT OF PHARMACOLOGY AND TOXICOLOGY NSERC Undergraduate Student Research Award (USRA)

## **2019 APPLICATION GUIDELINES**

The Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology has been allocated <u>one</u> NSERC USRA position for the summer of 2019. This year's award recipient will train under the supervision of **Dr. Walter Swardfager** on a project related to his NSERC-funded research program. This award provides UofT and non-UofT undergraduate students with an opportunity to gain valuable research experience during the summer session.

The student is required to submit a written final report with a length of at least three double-spaced pages (not including references) and give a 10-15 minute oral presentation of their research to the department in August. Both forms of presentation should address the nature of research conducted by the student including: the scientific background relevant for the research topic, objectives/hypotheses, methodology, results, and discussion and conclusions. The supervisor should provide the student with feedback on the written and oral presentation, and must submit a copy of the final report to the Program Coordinator by **August 31, 2019**.

### **Duration:**

• Students are expected to engage in full-time research for 16 full consecutive weeks between May 1 and September 30, as agreed upon with the supervisor. The full stipend is a minimum of \$5,625 (\$4,500 from NSERC + a minimum of \$1,125 paid by the sponsoring professor).

### **Eligibility:**

- Students must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada.
- Registered either full-time or part-time (at the time of application) in a bachelor's degree program in at least one of the two terms immediately before holding the award. NSERC, however, expects that most awards will be held by full-time students.
- Must have obtained, over the previous years of study, a cumulative average of at least second class (a grade of B or B-, if applicable).
- Must have completed, <u>at the time of application by March 18, 2019</u>, a minimum of <u>two</u> academic terms/semesters. Note that current first-year students are therefore excluded.
- Graduating students may hold the award in the term immediately following the completion of their undergraduate program requirements, as long as they have not started a program of graduate studies.
- A student may hold only one USRA per fiscal year and may hold a maximum of three USRAs throughout his/her university career.

Students participating in this program <u>cannot</u> receive a course credit (e.g., PCL472Y or PCL474Y) for this work. However, students on a co-op work term or PEY placement are eligible if all other criteria are met.

### Interested students should:

Submit the following documentation directly to Dr. Swardfager (w.swardfager@utoronto.ca) by March 1, 2019: a resume or curriculum vitae (CV), a list of references, and an official academic transcript(s). After the top-ranked applicant has been identified by Dr. Swardfager and agreement has been reached between the student and supervisor, the student will be required to complete the NSERC on-line application well in advance of the University of Toronto deadline of March 18, 2019.
