JOB POSTING – SESSIONAL LECTURER

Course Number and Title: PCL1100H1S: Applied Skills in Clinical Pharmacology

Course Description:

This graduate course for students registered in the Applied Clinical Pharmacology (ACP) MSc field of study introduces fundamental principles of clinical research and provides students with the skills necessary for the design, execution, analysis, and critical evaluation of clinical studies in pharmacology. Students will become familiar with various research approaches, methodologies, and strategies commonly employed in clinical pharmacology. Specifically, lectures will cover observational and experimental study designs and techniques; clinical data measurements, collection, and analysis; evidence review (systematic reviews/meta-analysis); ethical, legal, and regulatory guidelines governing clinical research; safety monitoring and adverse event reporting (pharmacovigilance); and key principles of pharmacoeconomics. In addition, students will be introduced to current topics and conceptual issues related to clinical research in pharmacology, and will learn to critically appraise clinical research.

Qualifications: Applicants must have completed a PhD in Pharmacology or an MD or related degree and have knowledge of clinical research design and drug development, bioethics, and pharmacoeconomics.
