Course Number and Title: PCL201H1S: Introduction to Pharmacology and Pharmacokinetic Principles.

# **Course Description:**

A general introduction to the principles of pharmacology and pharmacokinetics. Topics include chemical (drug) absorption, distribution, biotransformation, elimination; the calculation of dosages and pharmacokinetic parameters, variability in drug response, adverse drug reactions and special interest topics.

**Qualifications:** The ideal applicant will have a doctoral degree (PhD) with a specialization in the field of pharmacology, toxicology, or related biomedical field. Strong knowledge of PK principles required. Demonstrated experience teaching undergraduate students, knowledge and skills within Pharmacokinetic Principles, strong communication and collaboration skills is preferred. Demonstrated ability to teach/train students in PK and related topics. Demonstrated experience sharing with students the use logic, reason and evidence, knowledge on proper search structure and sources, clinical trial methodology, professionalism.

# **Description of duties:**

- Working with the course coordinator to help develop and deliver content for tutorial sessions (Wednesdays 4-5pm). In-tutorial content may include teambased active learning assessments, brief lectures on topics that integrate course content with research and learning skills required for students to succeed in Pharmacology. There will be 5 sessions with content based active learning and another 3 sessions that will focus on professional and career development. One panel will involve hosting a career/alumni panel.
- Developing student team tutorial assignments (4 in total), providing rubrics and oversee TA grading of these student assignments
- Contact time with students as needed regarding tutorials
- Invigilation of course assessments, as needed.
